WE STAND WITH THE CHICAGO TEACHERS IN THE FIGHT FOR:

- **Smaller class sizes.** Classes of 35 to 45 students are absolutely unacceptable, and even 30 students in a classroom is too high.
- A library and for a librarian in every school. Three-quarters of CPS schools have no librarian.
- A social worker in every school. Since 2013 the number of CPS social workers has fallen from 378 to 309.
- **A union nurse in every school.** There are just over 160 certified school nurses serving nearly 400,000 students, down from over 200 in 2013.
- **Stable classrooms.** CPS must stop laying off experienced teachers because new hires are paid less. The number of African-American teachers has been more than cut in half over the past two decades.
- **Full funding of special education.** CPS must reverse cuts and increase special education teachers.
- An end to attacks on majority Black and Latino schools. CPS focused its closure of 50 schools in 2014 on Black and Latino neighborhoods.
- **No cuts in compensation.** Teachers work extremely hard and deserve fair pay. There should be no cuts in compensation. In 2014 the Chicago fire fighters' union and Chicago police officers' union each signed a five-year contract with the City giving an 11% raise, or 2.2% a year.
- The Chicago Teachers Union is making the case not just for themselves, but for the **schools that**Chicago's students deserve. The union supports an ordinance that would release up to \$400 million in TIF surplus funds to stabilize the district's finances. Renegotiating high-interest loans would save CPS and taxpayers tens of millions of dollars.
